### **REFLECTION:** Exodus 12.1-14; Psalm 149; Romans 13.1-10; Matt. 18.10-20

Today's gospel is, for the Church across the world, the Discourse of the Community. In the accounts of Peter's ministry we have heard proclaimed in the gospel narratives the past few Sundays, we have heard that the grace to forgive, and to reconcile has been given to his Church, through Peter's great commissioning.
