We meet today in the name of Jesus Christ

I would like to welcome everyone who have come to St Pauls today, and thank you all for being here as we take leave of our friend, and brother in Christ, Tony. We also want to remember the family and friends who could not be with us today in body, but are with us here in spirit.

Today we come together

to remember before God our *brother Antonious Leenaars - Tony* ,

to give thanks for *his* life and to comfort one another in our grief.

So let us pray

Gracious Spirit, creator of life, carrier of hope, make your presence known among us.

Enable us to be brave in our remembering, honest in our sorrow, and open in love and

compassion to each other. Help us to seek not so much answers to our questions, but,

rather, the patience to mourn and grieve. Enable us to remember with joy the life of one

whom we have loved. Send us your peace. Amen

Human beings have sensed the mystery of death, and the pain of grief, since time immemorial. Every society has developed rites to mark the passage from life through death, and to commemorate the dead. Today we do this through this memorial service.

The wounds of grief need time and care to heal. This service may help this process, by enabling us to acknowledge our loss, give thanks for the life of Tony, make our last farewell, and begin to take up life once more.

Christians believe in God, the source and giver of life. God's good news proclaims Jesus Christ to be our living Lord, who laid down his life for us. He knew death, yet triumphed over it, and was raised by God to new life. Christians affirm the presence of the Spirit of Christ, who helps us in our weakness. Yet we, with all mortals, still face death. Those who put their trust in Christ share the sufferings of their Lord, even in the midst of God's love and care.

A Christian service proclaims the Christian hope in the face of death— Jesus Christ, whose resurrection is the promise of our own.

So We gather in the presence of God, and remember Tony, and all who he was in our lives. We will listen and respond to the word of God,

and proclaim the death and resurrection of Christ, giving thanks for the life that has now ended. We than leave Tony in God's care,

and we continue our life's journey.

We gather here not just to mourn the absence of our friend Tony, but also to celebrate in his life. Although we are sad to see him leave us, we can be comforted in the knowledge that he is now finally at peace and his soul has finally gone home to be with God. Even though Tony is no longer living in the flesh, the memory of him lives on in our hearts.

Many of us are here because at one time or another, Tony touched our lives in a special way – whether they were powerful statements of love and friendship, or just a friendly greeting on the street. Tony's life and witness draws us together today, and points us forward after he is gone.

As I remember Tony, he never wanted any extra praise or particular attention, but enjoyed doing the small things that made other people happy. These memories should encourage us to follow in this Christ-like path, of doing small acts of service to others.

As Christ says in *Matthew 25:40*: "Whatever you did for the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

I think we can all attest that this is how Tony truly lived his life.

For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Address

We have heard about Tony's journey through life and have heard that God travelled with him in the light as well as in the shadows

I'm sure there are times when we all feel helpless against the things which hold us back. But Christians believe that standing beside us is the gentle spirit of Jesus who walks before us, calls us on into life through the holy spirit.

The Romans reading we jus heard, Slide 9

as well as this verse in Hebrews, tells us that we are never alone in this journey of life and we know that God will never leave us nor forsake us, even until the end of time. He will walk with us down the pathways of our fears and hardship and will lead us to eternal life.

This was true for Tony. He is with God now in eternity – no more troubles, no more confusion, no more tears, only peace and love.

"Do not fear, for I have redeemed you;

Candle Lighting Ceremony

[Unlit candles are arranged before the service / funeral in the front of the room, with one larger candle lit and burning. This larger candle can be used to light the other candles by guests.]

The Candle is the sign of the light, warmth and power of the Holy Spirit. It reminds us of Tony's journey and of ours as well. We light this candle for Tony.

It reminds us that the Spirit always moved ahead of him and us. It is a symbol of the warmth of the love of God for Tony and for us. That love surrounded Tony and it surrounds us, wherever we go. It gives us courage for the next step in our journeys.

We here today because we remember with fondness and love Tony Leenaars, because he was a part of our lives and we will always carry his memories in our hearts and as a part of our very beings. He was cared for and loved by Nick in particular along with many other of us. He will always, in part, remain with us here at St Pauls.

Now, I invite you to come forward to light a candle in memory of Tony, perhaps say a quiet prayer and remember a special time you spent with him.

[After all candles are lit, and there is a small pause, continue with the ceremony.]

We pray that Tony's memory will live on among us and that all the dead, especially those we have loved may enjoy eternal life.

Merciful God, we pray for Tony's family and friends, remembering especially Nick, whose sense of loss is so keen.
When we cannot understand the things that happen, and are weighed down by grief and loneliness, uphold us in your love.
Give us the assurance of your constant care, that we may have courage for the days ahead. through Jesus Christ our friend. Amen.

We pray for those who have gone before us
God of grace and glory
we remember those who have gone before us,
who have stood by us and helped us,
who have cheered us by their sympathy
and strengthened us by their example;
We remember especially today Tony's beloved wife Leonie
